
FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

BE ... My first reaction in most situations is *to do* something: fix, say, plan, etc. Jesus teaches us to *be present* with other people.

BE STILL ... Our culture encourages us to always be active. If we're not busy and moving, then we are being lazy or lax. But all the busyness can prevent us from hearing and seeing the really important messages from the Spirit.

BE STILL AND KNOW ... I am impatient. I want answers and insights NOW! But too often I'm asking the wrong questions. God says *some things take time*, and the Spirit often surprises us with new directions while I wait on answers to *my questions*.

BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM ... God tells Moses, *Tell the people of Israel that "I AM" has sent you.* I AM is a verb that indicates the existence of an entity or its qualities (definition from Oxford Dictionary). **God** *was,* **God** *is,* **God** *will be.* There is no when ... no where ... no why that excludes God's presence.

BE STILL AND KNOW THAT I AM GOD ... The triune God - the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; the God of Peter, James and John; the God of the Apostle Paul; the God of my mother and grandmother and great-great grandmother - is the giver of life, the sustainer of hope, the bringer of joy, the pure essence of love and mercy. GOD is more than I can comprehend or wonder.

The Psalmist words of God's reaches across the millennia to us today. In this New Year of 2023, may we offer ourselves to God each day, and hear the voice in our hearts

be still and know that I am Lord.

Property Ministry Team News



Hello St. James Family!

In light of the environment we are in with regards to violence in public places the Church Council has elected, based on recommendations from the Property Ministry Team, to implement a few precautions to improve our posture to provide a safe worship experience.

We are planning to take the following actions:

- 1. Reinstate the "Rover" position who will maintain a presence on the Church campus (primarily outside) during the Worship Service hour. This will be a volunteer in addition to the Ushers.
- Limit access to the Church building by keeping only the main entrance doors (the double doors and single door in the Gathering Space/west side) unlocked on Sunday mornings. ALL other doors will remain locked.
- 3. Educate. The Property Team will provide training/instruction on the Run, Hide, Fight plan. This was presented to area churches by the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office this past fall and includes an informational video made by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This training will be given to Council Members, Ushers, and Sunday School Teachers at a minimum, but is open to all Congregation members.
- 4. Identifying interior doors of specific rooms that currently do not lock and installing a barricade system/device.

These actions are lessons learned and provided by the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office and specifically geared towards our area churches.

The implementation will begin in February 2023.

UPDATES FROM "COMFORT BLANKET" MINISTRY - not to be confused with Quilting Ministry-

St. James became involved with "comfort blankets" in March of 2019.

Prime Timers program for April of 2019 was Faith Boehmer, Prevention and Volunteer Coordinator at CAC. (Child Advocacy Center). She relayed to a primetime member CAC needed "comfort blankets"--and that is how our participation in the ministry started.

Donations from St. James have been:

2019 - 100 blankets

2020 - 370 blankets

2021 - 100 blankets

2022 - 320 blankets

A few facts about the CAC. Before Cumberland County had a CAC, child abuse victims were required to go from agency to agency re-telling the story of their abuse many times. With the CAC, the child has one forensic interview at the CAC with a trained interviewer in a non-threatening child-friendly setting.

At the conclusion of a child's visit to the CAC, the Victim/Family Advocate helps the child select a fleece blanket to take home. The Comfort Blankets are a tangible way to show support and care to these children who have experienced trauma. As the child uses the blanket while sitting on a couch or curled up in bed at night, they can be reminded that someone cared for them.

Prior to covid, small groups met at St. James to "cut" and "tie" blankets. We hope to be able to safely do this in the near future.

A total of \$8,600 was divided among the four recipients.

Another wish was to provide support to Lutheran Family Services and Lutheran Services for the Aging. We were able to send \$5,000 for this year from the interest on her endowment.

We at St James are honored to be able to carrying out Theda Suggs's wishes for God's ministries.
