Following an interview at the Child Advocacy Center (CAC) or at the child medical exam or maybe even from a law enforcement agent, a child will receive a "comfort blanket". These are no sew fleece blankets. These blankets are given to children to provide "comfort" to them. Coming to the CAC, having a medical exam or having a law enforcement officer talk to them can be intimidating, scary and can create its own trauma. The blanket can serve as a reminder that someone believes in them.

Saint James just completed making their 1000th comfort blanket for the Child Advocacy Center — ultimately to the children we serve. The 2022 Outstanding Community Group award is going to St. James Lutheran Church. Here to receive the award was Marcia Katt. She really is the backbone to their success.
