

#### From the Stewardship Team: "Attempt Great Things for The Lord"


Materials are being developed and mailed to each family in the congregation about the 2024 Ministry Spending Plan. We hope to provide information, inspiration, and a request to prayerful offer an intention of giving at the end of November (a few years back, we called it a pledge).

The last two years, our spending for ministry has exceeded our giving through general offerings by a 10-15 thousand dollars. The deficit has been covered by funds generated by an endowment.

One goal for 2024, is to narrow that deficit so that endowment funds are freed up for other ministry. We are seeking a total of 60 giving units to return intent cards. A giving unit is one family regardless of single, married, children, etc. An important part of this goal is to have those 60 intent cards include 5 new giving units (maybe not new to giving through a church, but new to St. James), and 15 giving units that intend to increase their giving.

The next mail piece will offer more information about recent giving patterns at St. James, as well as an overview of the 2024 Ministry Spending Plan.

Thanks for the continued and faithful generosity that allows St. James to be a positive presence in the community. As our theme proclaims: we ask God to work through us and provide the vision, resources, and strength to Attempt Great Things For The Lord!
