Lent is the 40-day period leading up to Easter Sunday. It is a period of sacrifice, in keeping with Christ's sacrifices leading up to his crucifixion and resurrection. Typically, many people "give up" something during this period.

The things that we give up – like smoking, chocolate, or fast food – are things that we should usually have only in moderation, if at all. Of course, those sacrifices are also mostly self-serving.

This Lent, in addition to "giving up" something to ourselves, maybe we can add a "take up" activity. Give up some of our time each day to serve others and see what affect God can make with our "bits" at the end of 40 days.

We could "take up" something as simple as cleaning our wardrobe each day by choosing one article of no longer needed clothing, resulting in 40 items "given away" to bless someone in need of clothing - and choosing one item a day is much easier than trying to clean out your wardrobe all at once!

Even little children can participate in this activity – a parent can choose two items of clothing, two books, or two toys that are no longer age-appropriate and ask, "Which one do you want to give away today?" "Give up" time to do yardwork for 40 days – and "take up" the gift of a tidy and trimmed yard for a neighbor. "Give up" 7 dozen baked cookies or a large casserole/stew in one day, and "take up" gifting servings for the next 7 days to a shut in or a member of the neighbor who you would like to know better.

Keep track of your activities on a daily calendar, noting what you did and for whom. (We hope to have one prepared and available by Feb 14.) A daily calendar lets you note your progress each day. At the end of the 40 days, you and your children can see how many people, family, or friends God has blessed through our "giving away". God makes disciples of each of us through small acts of kindness and service done daily and intentionally. A new habit can be developed – serving others, and therefore Christ, each day.





Lenten Mid-Week Wednesdays Meal at 5:45pm and Vespers at 6:45 pm

This Lent, we are focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. In Peter, we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. In Peter, we often see ourselves. By following Peter's journey, we watch the story of Jesus unfold through the eyes of a very normal

human trying to figure it all out—just like us.

We'll use the lyrics of "Come Thou Fount" as we study Peter's faith journey. It's as if Peter himself wrote this song. Like many of us, Peter has a wandering heart. His journey is not polished, or linear, or perfect, but he is always tethered to the love of God.

In this series, we want to affirm that faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows. We want to affirm the ways Peter keeps going: he drops his nets, he walks on water, he runs to the empty tomb, he swims to the shore to meet the risen Christ. He keeps searching and yearning and loving, even after missteps or mistakes. Ultimately, in Peter's story, we are reminded that God loves imperfect people—in fact, time and again, that's precisely who God claims and calls.

This Lent, we will look for ourselves in the stepping stones of Peter's story. We will reflect on the stages of our own faith journeys as well as who and what has shaped us along the way. As we wander, let us tune our hearts to sing God's grace. May we rest in streams of mercy, never ceasing.

This series is developed by the creative and faithful talents of **A Sanctified Art**, a talented creative team of pastors, artists, and writers. Trained theologians and pastors, they are also artists and creators. They are called to be artists just as much as ministers; in order to faithfully offer their gifts to the Church and world, they cannot set their creativity aside. Parsonage Repair

A few months ago, we discovered evidence of possible damage to the flooring of the parsonage kitchen. Last Wednesday, Beck's Home Improvement began work to repair the damage. After removing lower cabinets, appliances, sink, and the subflooring, they discovered that several joists and part of one main support beam has suffered significant moisture damage – probably over the last 10-15 years. The necessary repairs are taking place, and the job should be finished on Friday, February 2.

Anna Lisa and I are grateful to Todd Burns and Dave Runkle for their attention to the task and their oversight to make this repair happen.
