
The 2024 Stewardship Campaign continues. To date, 41 giving units (families) have returned giving intent cards totaling annual intended giving of \$165,840.

## **Ministry teams**

How did that fellowship meal come about? ... How do I go about becoming an usher for worship? ... Who plans summer activities for our children/families? ...

Great questions. Unfortunately, there are no good answers. One of the things that suffered during the pandemic were our Ministry Teams. Coming out of the pandemic, 9 of the 12 ongoing ministry teams were no longer functioning or non-existent. The 2024 congregation council has made a priority to review, revise, and renew a number of our ministry teams.

Our newly *re-formed* Fellowship Planning Team (see previous page) will plan and give oversight to congregational fellowship events, meals, and receptions throughout the course of the year. They will recruit volunteers for the particular events. The objectives of the team will be to emphasize relationships: *Joyfully connecting. Faith. Life. People.* As new individuals and families begin worshipping and exploring faith through St. James, we will need opportunities to create and build new relationships.

Do you have particular gifts, interests, passions, abilities, dreams, goals ...? Then, St. James needs your energy, gifts, and passions to build and develop ministries.

**EVANGELISM** Be a story-teller. Help the congregation share God's story with the community. Work with our social media and website efforts to give awareness and invitation to the congregation and community about how the gospel is proclaimed at and through St. James. Give oversight to our greeter and hospitality efforts.

**CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** Help others grow in faith. Oversee and develop the ways we teach and model faith in the congregation. As growing disciples of Jesus, we need to know the stories of faith from the Bible, as well as absorb the teaching of the Spirit as we learn. We want to learn how our Christian faith is relevant to our daily lives. This team can help in many ways, from Sunday morning in -person classes to on-line learning, from group Bible study to individual growth studies, from children through adults, from Sunday through Saturday, from Christmas to Easter, from Adam and Eve to Abraham and Sarah to Ruth and Boaz to the disciples Peter, James, and John, to the disciples Mary, the other Mary, and Priscilla.

**WORSHIP AND MUSIC** Worship is central to the life of a congregation. For a large number of people, it is the first encounter with the congregation. Worshipping well, with integrity and faithful commitment, offers life and vitality to a congregation. This ministry team is charged with assisting the pastor and music staff in crafting and maintaining a high level of excellence in our worship life: overseeing the maintenance of music equipment and instruments; supporting altar guild with proper care and use of paraments and worship items; assisting with recruiting and training ushers, worship leaders (assisting ministers, communion assistants, lectors, acolytes, etc.); promoting variety in worship through art, music, movement, etc.; assisting with recruitment of members for vocal choirs, handbell choirs, and other groups and ensembles; work with pastor(s) and organist/pianist and/or choir director in planning and evaluating worship (both in-person and live-stream.)



# Fayetteville HymnSingers in Concert at St. James



# Lenten Mid-Week Wednesdays Meal at 5:45pm and Vespers at 6:45 pm

This Lent, we are focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. In Peter, we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. In Peter, we often see ourselves. By following Peter's journey, we watch the story of Jesus unfold through the eyes of a very normal human trying to figure it all out—just like us.

We'll use the lyrics of "Come Thou Fount" as we study Peter's faith journey. It's as if Peter himself wrote this song. Like many of us, Peter has a wandering heart. His journey is not polished, or linear, or perfect, but he is always tethered to the love of God.

In this series, we want to affirm that faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows. We want to affirm the ways Peter keeps going: he drops his nets, he walks on water, he runs to the empty tomb, he swims to the shore to meet the risen Christ. He keeps searching and yearning and loving, even after missteps or mistakes. Ultimately, in Peter's story, we are reminded that God loves imperfect people—in fact, time and again, that's precisely who God claims and calls.

This Lent, we will look for ourselves in the stepping stones of Peter's story. We will reflect on the stages of our own faith journeys as well as who and what has shaped us along the way. As we wander, let us tune our hearts to sing God's grace. May we rest in streams of mercy, never ceasing.

This series is developed by the creative and faithful talents of **A Sanctified Art**, a talented creative team of pastors, artists, and writers. Trained theologians and pastors, they are also artists and creators. They are called to be artists just as much as ministers; in order to faithfully offer their gifts to the Church and world, they cannot set their creativity aside. They offer their creative gifts to resource, provoke, guide, facilitate, and enrich the spiritual lives of worshipers around the world.
