
DISASTER RELIEF UPDATES

Ornaments Money cannot buy Chrismons Light Trees with Love

What hangs on the tree in white and gold can be given or made, but never sold? The answer can be found at our Saint James Lutheran church. Each year in the chancel, two stately cedar trees twinkle with white lights. Their evergreen boughs are laced with delicate white and gold ornaments. These are no ordinary tree decorations as any church member will tell you. They are *Chrismons* – symbols of Christ. These ornaments cannot be bought. Each one is made by a Christian as act of worship and love.

Saint James had our first *Chrismon Tree* in 1962. These symbols are ancient in origin – the circle, the fish – their use in modern worship has come about in the last 30 years.



The tradition of the Chrismon Tree began in 1957 at the Lutheran Church of Ascension in Danville, Virginia. A woman by the name of <u>Frances Spencer</u> volunteered to decorate the church Christmas Tree. Mrs. Spencer wanted the Christmas Tree to truly celebrate the birthday of Christ and did research and discovered designs called *Chrisma* that were used by the early church to represent Christ and identify places of worship. Mrs. Spencer translated the designs into Christmas Tree ornaments made of Styrofoam, wire, and beads and called her decorations *Chrismons*, deriving from the words "Christ and monograms".



The church was deluged with orders from families and churches for *Chrismons* or for directions to make them. When members of Saint James decided to make Chrismons, they made two trips to meet with Mrs. Frances Spencer. The designs are copy-righted to prevent commercialism for they can't be sold. They have to be made.

Making Chrismons is no easy task. They take long hours and lots of patience to create and are combinations of several symbols. Not all *Chrismons* have old meanings. One at Saint James is a dove within a circle and is a symbol for Lutheran Church Women. The Chrismon Tree is put up before the fourth Sunday in Advent in time for a special service. All *Chrismons* on the tree were made by the women of the church. Chrismons are made only in white lights reflecting the purity and majesty of the Son of God.

Update on "Comfort Blanket" ministry



The "Comfort Blanket" ministry started in April of 2019. We primarily donate to our Child Advocacy Center (CAC). We have a great working relationship with them. They know they can contact us if they are running low. On October 29, we received a text they had ran out. They had interviewed approximately 40 children the previous two weeks. They like to give these victims of domestic situations a "comfort blanket". A few people met the following day and made and delivered 20 blankets.

As of October 30, 2024 we have donated 1510 blankets to the CAC.
