Each May, the North Carolina Synod comes together for a time of worship, learning, and fellowship. Every other year, this gathering also includes conducting important synod business. Voting members selected from each congregation join pastors and deacons to make key decisions, including approving the budget, electing synod council members, and, this year, selecting a new bishop, as Tim Smith retires.



# CHILDREN MINISTRY TEAM to be developed – A call to parents of children Pre-K – 5<sup>th</sup> grade, and other interested and talented adults.

Jesus told the disciples "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matt. 19:14) It is thrilling and joyous that almost 15 children (pre-k – 5<sup>th</sup> grade) now attend worship with regularity. St. James congregation has not experienced this number in several years. We have not had an active ministry team since we returned to in-person worship at the end of Covid.

It is my hope and prayer that God raises up at least 3-5 people who, with the help of parents and others, will oversee events and activities to teach and share faith formation to our children. The main areas of foci will be:

- 1) Weekly faith formation (Sunday School)
- 2) Nursery during worship; and
- 3) Fellowship and activity events (i.e. monthly or bi-monthly) for children and family.



This team will do planning, recruiting, and support, so that many folks will have opportunity to serve.




