FOR FURTHER THOUGHT by Rev. John Locke

The disciples were able to see that the people were tired and hungry; and, they did not have a clear answer for what to do about it - other than send them home! While they were probably thrilled with the size of the crowd coming to be with Jesus, they were also overwhelmed at the logistical challenge they faced. The magnitude of the issue makes them forget about the power of the One they follow.

CONSIDER

Have you ever been given a dream or goal that, if it could happen, would change a congregation, family, community, business, etc.? And, for a brief moment you allow yourself to think of the wonder and possibility of how life would change for so many. And then a voice was heard – maybe within your own head or heart – but there’s no way we could do that. Between lack of money and half of the volunteers getting ready to go home, the excuses begin to pile up. The need slips away and the excuses come forward in baskets.
